



# Trash to Treasure Poster

Now that you have the data from your clean-up you need to do something with it! You will work in a group to show your data in a table and as a graph. You will also spend some time learning about the effects of one of the types of garbage on wildlife and share some facts you learned on your poster.

Poster should include:

- Title
- Date
- Your school name
- Your names
- The location of your beach clean-up
- A table that shows the quantity of each category of garbage collected. Compare your group's data to the rest of the class.
- You can also compare the weight of the garbage your class collected to previous years (see graph below). Did you find more or less garbage (by weight) at your location this year?
- A graph that highlights the frequency and/or percentage of each type of garbage collected – this can be a pie chart or a bar graph.
- Information on the effects of one of the types of garbage (ex: plastic, cigarette butts, etc.) your group collected on local wildlife. Your teacher has some resources to help with your research.

Poster size: approximately 22.5" × 28.5" Regular Bristol board or poster board.
